# The Anthem this Week

Those who once used the old red hymn book of 1971 will recognise the text of this hymn written by John Keble in 1827, set originally to the familiar tune, Franconia, which does appear once in Voices United ("We give you but your own", which we have used an offertory response from time to time). Keble was a leading figure in the Oxford Movement, which, in the mid nineteenth century, reacted to the more evangelical tendencies introduced by John Wesley a century earlier. This setting is by Richard Eaton, who died in 1968 at the relatively young age of 54. His later years were spent as a lecturer in the Music section of the Department of Fine Arts in the University of Alberta, one of his responsibilities being conductor of the University Singers. The ensemble was renamed The Richard Eaton Singers following his death, and is now the symphonic chorus in Edmonton.
