Sign the petition and support our Indigenous brothers and sisters of the Island Lake area of Manitoba, (Garden Hill, St. Theresa Point, Wassagamack and Red Sucker Lake) who are lobbying the government for a hospital to be built that will service the 14, 000 Indigenous people who are in need of this facility. There are serious health problems that need to be addressed in the region and accessibility to health services is limited and inadequate. Please sign the petition at the back of the church.
