The Anthem this Week

This beautifully reflective anthem comes from John Stainer's 1887 oratorio, "The Crucifixion". As the text is a central tenet of our Christian religion, it is no wonder that there have been many settings of these verses from John's Gospel, including one by Herb Belyea, a former conductor of the St. Andrew's choir. Stainer's version is perhaps the most well known and most often performed. In style typical of the Romantic period, the music proceeds slowly and profoundly sadly through the text, making sure to make the most of the sentiment of the words.
