FIND YOUR PLACE

It is so refreshing to be back for in-person services in the sanctuary at St. Andrew's. And we are continuing, for the time being, with the on-line option for those for which that fits their particular situation.

Please note the announcement above that St. Andrew's will be implementing a policy requiring proof of vaccination beginning Sunday, November 14.

We continue with the following basics to keep everyone.

- Face masks are required as you enter the building. A reminder to use hand sanitizer when you enter.
- Please enter through the Kingsway St. (east side) door. Only those with mobility issues who require use of the elevator should enter through the Oak St. entrance.
- A Greeter will welcome you at a desk in the narthex to record your attendance. It allows us to keep a record of all attenders in case any follow-up contact were required.
- An Usher will then escort you to a sanctuary seat. A seating plan is in place to mark 'Usable' sanctuary seats to
 ensure appropriate social distancing.
- Appropriate exiting at the conclusion of the service is important.

The church office is open during the week and you can enter the building through the Oak St. door. Health restrictions require you to wear a face mask once inside the building.

General Protocols for Reception for Derek Morphy

- Remember to keep your face masks on as you proceed down to the church auditorium. Please leave a reasonable amount of space in the line-up to enter the auditorium.
- We have arranged for seating (5 seats) around the larger round tables and for groups of two (or three) at the smaller card tables. Choose what is comfortable for you.
- Once you are seated, you can remove your mask and enjoy lunch.
- Lunch is contained in pre-packaged clamshell style containers at each seat location. A selection of sandwiches, cheese, veggie, fruit and dainty.
- Masks should be removed only when eating, drinking or speaking from the podium behind plexiglass.
- Coffee/tea will be served at the tables. We ask that you remain seated during lunch, followed by a short program.
- Washrooms are available below the narthex and by the hallway to the elevator.
