Reminder on COVID Protocols at St. Andrew's

It is exciting to have returned to In-Person services at St. Andrew's and, of course, to continue to provide a recorded online option for folks that are unable to attend in person.

We know that Manitoba Health has relaxed restrictions for most public settings. However, here at St. Andrew's we continue to require proof of vaccination and wearing of masks for persons 12 years and older to attend services in person. And we continue to follow social distancing protocols regarding seating.

Looking ahead, we will revisit the need to continue these restrictions depending on the prospect of further declining hospitalizations and ICU numbers.
