The original text of this anthem praises Solomon's wisdom after he judiciously deals with two women who claimed the same child as their own ("Swell the Full Chorus"). The new text in the version heard today has the same intention as the original, but praises God instead of Solomon. Today's solo is taken from the first section of Messiah, as part of the prophecy of Jesus' birth. In a full performance, this solo would be followed by the joyful chorus "For Unto Us a Son is Born."
