Siyahamba!

Our first hymn today, We Are Marching (Siyahamba), is a South African Zulu song that was first written down in the 1950s, although whether it was newly composed or had been part of the oral tradition in South Africa is unsure. It was not originally intended to be a protest or antiapartheid song, but Siyahamba has become a song of freedom and hope for many across the world. The English words are a direct translation of the Zulu text: Siyahamba ekukhanyeni kwenkos - "we are walking/marching in the light of God."

In 2006 A song of Faith was adopted as another statement of faith, in the same way as other creeds of the United Church such as The New Creed, "It seeks to provide a verbal picture of what The United Church understands its faith to be in the historical, political, social, and theological context of the early 21st century. It is also a means of ongoing reflection and an invitation for the church to live out its convictions in relation to the world in which we live."

The 20 Articles of Doctrine, A statement of Faith, a New Creed, and A Song of Faith are all recognized as standards and beliefs of our faith. For the whole text of the Song of Faith and background information check the link on our eblast.
