This week's anthem is an arrangement of the traditional Spiritual, "Let De Heaven Light Shine On Me." February is Black History Month, a month to recognize and celebrate the history and contributions of Black people across North America.

The tradition of Spirituals that we enjoy singing now, comes from the songs sung by those enslaved in the Southern United States. Many enslaved people were taught Christianity as a method of control, and the songs that came out of the enforced religion served a double-edged purpose: to mollify their overseers, and to give strength and unity among themselves. Often, Spirituals include phrases about freedom, Heaven, or the promised land.

Perhaps you've learned that these phrases were code words for the free states in the Northern United States, and for Canada beyond. And while this is true, they are also reassurances about what happens in death. Death was a constant threat and a reality for enslaved people, and perhaps these songs served as comfort for those who endured unimaginable hardships. It is important to sing these songs because they are part of our history (we, as Canadians are not as blameless as we sometimes believe; racism has played, and continues to play, a role in our country), but we should also remember the context in which they were originally written and sung
