John Standing Music Endowment Award

Many of you will remember John Standing who was Music Director at St. Andrew's for 12 years, retiring in 1998. John had the foresight to create a Music Endowment Fund at St. Andrew's starting with proceeds from an organ recital he performed in 2005. That fund has grown over the years.

This past spring, the St. Andrew's Church Council implemented a Bursary Program that would create an annual award of \$500 paid from the fund to a person who is part of our church community and who is pursuing training in perhaps voice, or a musical instrument.

The successful first recipient of the John Standing Music Endowment Award is Evan Demeduk. Evan completed his Grade 12 at Tech Voc High School in June. He will be enrolling in voice lessons. Our congratulations to Evan.
