The anthem this week

Today's anthem uses the text of a Mozarabic prayer. The Mozarabs were Christians living in the very large, we need a full complement of helpers Muslim-ruled territories of Iberia (present-day Spain) between 711-1492. They kept their Christian traditions, while also incorporating and taking influence from the Islamic/Arab culture around them. Over time, many Mozarabic people converted to Islam, and Arabic eventually started to replace Latin as the spoken vernacular of the Mozarabic Christians. There was a small community who kept their unique Mozarabic Christian traditions, and there are still some Mozarabic parishes in Spain. In my research, I found this text referred to as a morning prayer, but also as a prayer for "Joy and Peace in the Daily Walk."
