Today is the Reign of Christ Sunday or Christ the King Sunday. It refers to a feast in the liturgical year which emphasizes the true Kingship of Christ. The color white is used during seasons of celebration such as

Christmas/Epiphany and Easter and on special Sundays like Transfiguration Sunday, Trinity Sunday, All Saint's Day, and Reign of Christ Sunday. This Sunday is the last Sunday of the liturgical year.
