Advent is a time of waiting and anticipation, as we look forward to the long-awaited birth of the Christ Child, the Prince of Peace, King of Kings, Saviour, and Coming King. It is a time in which we wait for God, for the birth of hope, for the arrival of new life. As we wait, we

prepare our hearts to receive the gifts of God. We ask God to shape us and to prepare our hearts for the long-awaited Christ Child. May we begin to understand God's vision of Hope, Peace, Joy and Love each week as we light the candles.

Our Vision

To live as Christ would have us live, in love, with compassion and seeking justice, by sharing God's grace, learning from scripture, growing through the Spirit and being transformed by faith.

Send those thoughts to Karen and they will be used in the service and E Blast next week. All names will be anonymous. This week, look for where you see hope and where you do not.

Meaning of Advent

Advent is the beginning of the Church Year for most churches in Western tradition. It begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas Day, which is the Sunday nearest November 30th, and ends on Christmas Eve, December 24th. The focus of the entire season is the celebration of the birth of Jesus the Christ in his First Advent, and the anticipation of the return of Christ the King in his Second Advent. It is a time of preparation, to prepare for the way of the Lord. Each year we await the rebirth of Christ when the world will be reconciled with God. The Anointed One, a Messiah, will bring peace, justice, and righteousness to the world.

In recent times, however, Advent has undergone a shift in emphasis, reflected in a change of colours used in many churches. Many Protestant churches now use blue to distinguish the Season of Advent from the Season of Lent. The candles are lit each Sunday symbolizing Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love. The pink candle is the "Shepherd's Candle," symbolizing joy and pink is the liturgical colour for joy.

A note about O Come, O Come, Emmanuel

Today, we are singing "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel," one of our traditional Advent hymns, but to different words. As Advent drew closer, and the war in Israel and Palestine has continued, the words, "...and ransom captive Israel that mourns in lowly exile..." that appear in verse 1 gave us pause.

In this instance, the word "Israel" refers to the historical and Biblical name for God's chosen people; it does not refer to the modern political state of Israel. However, at this time, when there are pleas for peace and freedom from captivity on both sides of the Israel and Palestine war, we thought that today's alternative text captures that wider call for help and healing, and speaks to our own Advent wishes of Hope, Peace, Love and Joy.
