Music Note:

Today's anthem is the well-known carol, Good King Wenceslas. The carol tells the story of King Wenceslas venturing to take food and supplies to those in need on the Feast of Stephen (St. Stephen's Day, December 26). Wenceslas takes a Page with him, and they struggle with the snow and the cold until Wenceslas encourages the Page to follow in his footsteps and find warmth.

King Wenceslas was a real person, living in Bohemia (present-day Czech Republic) in the 900s. He was actually a Duke, but was made a King post-humously by the Holy Roman Emperor Otto I after being sainted for his acts of charity. This carol was written in 1853, and serves as a reminder that we can help those in need, and be blessed for doing so, throughout the year, and not just at Christmas.
