Patricia Baker is a minister without call and is officially associated with us She says:

Hello, my name is Patricia Baker. My husband, David Bergen, and I have a blended family of 5 children, who range in age now from 20 to 35. We love being Oma and Opa for baby Niko who is 7 months old. I have been involved in The United Church of Canada since birth and have been a Diaconal Minister for 23 years. Most of my ministry has been with Inner City Community Ministries, where I met Karen, and also in rural

congregations. Currently, I'm on the Board of Vocation and am glad that, although my days of congregational or outreach ministry have been cut short by some physical limitations, I can still be of service to our United Church.

I can still work and am currently the Box Office Manager with Winnipeg Jewish Theatre, which these weeks in particular, has given me a very up-close opportunity to reflect on our understanding of and relationship with the Holy Land.

During Lent, we will be studying together,

"Act Fast," by Alydia Smith. This is the newest Lenten devotional book from the United Church Publishing House. "In 2023 the Earth yelled in the exact way that scientists predicted; extreme weather, floods, drought, air pollution and fire." Together we will discuss the effects of climate change and question what can we do? What good could we possibly do? If you are interested in attending this Bible Study, let Rev.
