Music Note

George Matheson, a Scottish minister, wrote the text for this morning's anthem in 1882. Matheson, who became legally blind at age 20, was a prolific preacher, writer, and theologian, even preaching for Queen Victoria at Balmoral Castle. Matheson wrote "O Love That Will Not Let Me Go" on the eve of his sister's wedding, and he later recalled, "I am quite sure that the whole work was completed in five minutes, and equally sure that it never received at my hands any retouching or correction...this came like a dayspring from on high."
